The ADA & Beyond Providing a Quality Experience to Customers with Disabilities

On Monday, June 3, the Hangar Theater and the Finger Lakes Independence Center joined forces to present **The ADA & Beyond-Providing a Quality Experience to Customers with Disabilities** at the Tompkins County Public Library. Jeff Boles, Advocacy Specialist at the Finger Lakes Independence Center, spoke to the customer service staff at the Hangar Theatre and other community members about customer service as it relates to people with disabilities. Over 40 people attended this event.

The presentation covered the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) components of customer service, disability etiquette, and how to properly interact with customers with disabilities. Topics presented were reinforced through a 'jeopardy' game to test the audiences' knowledge of customer service and interacting with people with disabilities. Participants found the presentation interactive, informative, honest, concise, and helpful in terms of increasing their customer service skills.
